

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FILLING THE VOID: HOW VOLUNTEERING WITH WHEELS OF HOPE CHANGED MY LIFE

As I prepared to transition into retirement, reducing my work hours and eventually selling my practice, I knew I'd need something meaningful to fill the void. For years, my time had been defined by caring for my patients, interacting with my work family, and being a dedicated father to two daughters. I also love driving—spending time at Canadian Tire Motorsport Park (CTMP, formerly Mosport) feels like a second home. So when I discovered the Canadian Cancer Society's Wheels of Hope (WoH) program, it felt like a perfect match.

What is Wheels of Hope?

Wheels of Hope provides transportation services for cancer patients, helping them get to treatment centers with ease and dignity. For a nominal registration fee, clients avoid the stress and expense of driving and parking during what can often be lengthy and frequent appointments.

Why I Volunteer

Before becoming a dentist, I worked as a healthcare aide to pay for dental school, which deepened my passion for helping others. Joining WoH has allowed me to reconnect with that passion in a profoundly rewarding way. The gratitude I receive from patients and the supportive WoH staff is beyond measure. It's a reminder of the power of small actions to make a big difference in someone's life.

How Volunteering Works

The program is incredibly flexible. Volunteers can commit to a regular schedule—specific days each week—or respond to assignment requests via email whenever it suits their availability. Time off for vacations or other commitments is never an issue.

Volunteers have the option of using their own vehicles or driving a minivan donated by Honda Canada. In either case, mileage is reimbursed, including the distance from home to the minivan location.

The Need is Great

Sadly, few of us will go through life untouched by cancer—either personally or through a loved one. The demand for volunteer drivers far exceeds the current supply, leaving some clients without the support they desperately need.

I've been with this program for five years, and it continues to be a fulfilling part of my life. Knowing I'm helping people navigate one of the most challenging times of their lives keeps me coming back.

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Some months ago, I chanced upon a YouTube video of a session of a committee of the US House of Representatives which was investigating the management of the COVID-19 pandemic. The clip focussed on the questioning of Dr. L. Fauci*. Regardless of your opinion of the value of his guidance, he has been, and is still, regarded as one of the leading virologists and epidemiologists in the world. Dr. Fauci, in his capacity as Director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases from 1984-2022, had advised 7 Presidents, both Republican and Democratic. During his tenure, he gave input on the management of infectious viral diseases such as, HIV, Anthrax, Zika and Ebola. As a witness to the COVID-19 Committee, he attempted to answer questions posed by members who had no more knowledge of the biology and epidemiology of infectious diseases, and COVID-19 in particular, than the average citizen. There were a few issues which came to the surface during his testimony which provoked drafting this essay.

Dr. Fauci's answers reflected the current factual knowledge in the field. He tried to explain that virology deals with some species of viruses which act in an unpredictable manner. Understanding the unique nature of a virus and its variants takes time and just when you think you know how it behaves, and how to make a vaccine, it mutates. In the initial stages of an epidemic, virologists, immunologists, and public health officials can only draw upon their experience with similar viruses and offer their best recommendations. Referring to COVID-19, Fauci explained that as time went by, knowledge of the infectability,

early signs and symptoms, the most atrisk subjects, prevention, and treatment, became better understood and therefore, the public health recommendations, based on the new data, became more refined. Each enhancement in the knowledge base, required an assessment by a scientific committee, a consensus had to be reached, and finally the new guideline released to the medical profession and the public. During his questioning, he was severely rebuked because the current recommendations were quite different from the guidance which was offered three years prior. Although the public-health community readily adopted the new directives, the public was often left in a quandary, and some grew suspicious. They repeatedly asked, why is the advice changing? At the same time, unsubstantiated theories of conspiracy and corruption arose. To non-scientists the changing guidelines gave the impression that the ignorance of the past continued as ignorance in the present. As dentists, we understand that what we were taught in dental school reflected the

knowledge of the day. We do not dismiss our teachers as inept because what they taught and believed, 30 or 20 years ago, or even more recently, is no longer valid. As a scientific witness to the Committee, Dr. Fauci was called incompetent and one member proposed that his medical licence should be revoked. It was also suggested that he was personally responsible for the deaths of millions of Americans. That individual did not support this aggressive statement with even one scientific fact. The 'non-scientific' questions directed to a real scientist were instigated by a position which was completely outside that Representative's lane.

Politicians have every right to question how agencies work, how they are funded, and how they vet and disseminate information. A politician might even explore the social and economic spin-off when guidance is offered with weak levels of certainty. However, scientific facts are not dependent on the political views of the governing party. Public policy should be based on a single set of truths. A political party may suggest that a certain course of action should be taken, which from their point of view is in the best interest of the citizens. Another political party may derive different recommendations based on the same group of facts. Since there is usually only one party leading a government at any time, the public really has no choice. This results in hesitancy and lack of confidence. However, the public is in an increasing untenable position when there is no confidence that the underlying science is valid.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, an American President offered suggestions for the treatment of COVID-19 which were completely outside of his lane and outside of the expertise of some of his advisors. The President's knowledge of infectious diseases and human biology was no better than a high school student and perhaps less. In my utopian imagination, I expected a government leader to say: 'Your government is basing its health and safety recommendations on a set of facts which have been vetted by a team of experts. These recommendations are likely to change as we gain more knowledge or as the disease profile changes. When that happens, we will suggest appropriate alterations to the path forward.'

The prior COVID-19 based paragraphs were completed some time ago, and I decided not to submit them as the basis for an essay because the topic had become mostly passé. However, in recent months other examples of straying from one's expertise have come to the fore.

Many of us remember polio victims in iron lungs and leg braces, adults with facial scars who survived smallpox, deadly influenza epidemics, kids missing school with mumps, measles, whooping cough, and diphtheria. Sixty years later, there are good vaccines for all the above with newer vaccines for hepatitis, shingles, several types of pneumonia and even a type of cervical cancer.

As knowledge of virology improved and effective vaccines became available, moms, school nurses, family docs and publichealth officials did their best to protect kids from these preventable diseases. Vaccines were not without risk but the immediate health benefits overcame any skepticism. Vaccinating children and getting annual flu shots became routine. However, with less observable disease, we become complacent. In the last year or two, reports of infectious disease outbreaks, are increasingly being reported. Children are getting and spreading measles, whooping cough is on the rise, and isolated cases of polio have been reported. Public-health has reminded us to be vigilant, review your vaccine status, get updates and boosters. Just as we are prompted to take our vaccines, we are aware that there are vigorous claims that we should not.

The groups who choose not to get vaccinated and also choose not to vaccinate their children, have been dubbed non-vaxers. Misinformation, widely available and easily spread on social media, is based on farranging ideologies and suspicions. One group believes that the government uses vaccines to control the population. What they are trying to control and how this is done through vaccines is difficult to understand. Some believe that natural immunity is preferred-just let the weak die. I read that there is a group that believe big pharma is conspiring with the government. They overstate pandemics so that they can sell huge volumes of vaccine to satisfy stockholders and generate massive tax inputs. Some still cling to debunked myths of autism or infertility caused by COVID-19 vaccine. There are complaints that the true effectiveness of vaccines has not been validated in placebo-controlled studies. Although there were some studies in the past, no medical ethics committee would agree to such a study today. Many more reasons have been concocted, but none refute the enormous health and cost benefit of childhood vaccinations. Essentially the non-vaxers are making claims about science which are clearly outside of their lane.

There is another group which falls nicely into the theme of this essay. There are religious leaders who have been spreading the word that vaccines are evil and we should not intervene in (their) god's plan. Of course, vaccines post-date the bible and therefore no direct biblical reference can be found. True, these spokespeople do not represent the mainstream religions, which have either been silent or support vaccination. Nevertheless, the religious non-vaxers walk our streets, sit

next to our children in school and are treated in our hospitals. In addition, religious backed lobbies have forced some local governments and school boards to allow opting out of mandatory vaccination for religious reasons. One US Christian leader offers to provide a vaccination opt-out letter in exchange for a donation to his church. It is only a very rare orthodox Jewish leader who opposes vaccination. In the USA, 40% of white evangelicals, have stated that they will not accept vaccination. Their position is based on an unwillingness to support any action which might interfere with entry to heaven. Strangely they do wear seat belts and rarely let their kids climb over fences at the zoo.

Finally, I will mention a personal bugbear regarding straying from one's lane. I take no umbrage with families who send their children to a school which teaches a certified curriculum and also offers religious instruction. It is a personal choice. However, there has been a trend, particularly in the US, and creeping into Canada, that Christian Fundamentalist concepts are entering the mainstream public-school curriculum through demands by both parents and 3rd party groups. They are demanding that publicschools not exclude opinions and concepts which fall outside those approved by educators. One might have thought that the famous Scope's Monkey Trial and numerous other trials over the last twenty years, have settled the absurd creationist anti-evolution beliefs made by religious zealots. However, there has been a vigorous attempt to reintroduce non-scientific claims in subject areas such as biology and geography by changing the narrative from the Christian God to an Intelligent Designer. They claim that standard foundational science should be presented along with alternative beliefs (in particular, theirs). They claim that evolution, the driving force behind our understanding of biology and the grandeur of life, cannot survive scrutiny without the imposition of a magical third party. Our teachers are put in an untenable position. Teaching is hard enough without introducing myths and invalid beliefs. If believers of Intelligent Design, the Loch Ness monster, young earth creationism, extraterrestrial-made crop circles, flat earth, Sasquatch, alien abduction,

Noah's world-wide flood and a myriad of other tales, want their views heard in public schools: fair enough. Offer a voluntary course on modern myths and legends and leave our science teachers alone.

Most politicians are not scientists. Religious leaders should deal with morality and interpersonal relationships and leave public health to the experts. Science teachers should be left to their lane of expertise and not be influenced by those who cannot or should not teach the subject matter. So - Just stay in your lane.

The annual AO Revival cooking class took place on Wednesday Nov 6th, 2024 in the evening. We were so fortunate to have Chef Justin Friedlich teach and cook for us that evening. Justin was most recently the Chef de Cuisine at Buca Yorkville. He has started a personal business with various entities including cooking classes, retail food sales and private dining experiences. He studied Business Management at the Ivey School of Business at Western University and Culinary Management at George Brown's Culinary Arts Program. He has plans to open a restaurant in 2025 but most importantly he is the son of frater Joey Friedlich and his wife Linda! He was a fabulous and entertaining teacher and the food was beyond delicious. Frater Tammy Herzog generously hosted this event at her beautiful home in Thornhill. It was a sold-out event. We started the evening with a delicious mushroom soup that was followed by a panzanella salad and a rigatoni in a vodka rose sauce that was exceptional! Our main was seabass with a salmoriglio sauce and the side was brussels sprouts. For dessert we had an apple crumble with vanilla ice cream. Everything was delicious! Justin prepared and taught us in Tammy's kitchen and then we all sat down to eat dinner together in her dining room. The evening was filled with great food, wine, learning, conversation and camaraderie. Justin was so fabulous that I have hired him to do a holiday dinner in my home in the next few weeks.

Here are 2 recipes from our evening. The Salmoriglio is the sauce for the fish and was delicious. This can be stored in the fridge and removed when ready to use and only at that point should you add the vinegar and salt. If the vinegar is added before it will turn the parsley black and it won't look as nice. The vodka sauce is quite spectacular and I have made it many times since taking the class. The tomato passata is strained tomatoes, I have been using the Mutti brand. One of the tips that Justin gave for the pasta dish is to add a lot of salt in the water when boiling the noodles. He says to undercook the pasta by 2 minutes when boiling it so you can continue to cook the noodles in the sauce on the stove for 2 minutes more so they get completely drenched. Hope you enjoy these recipes! If you have never attended this event and you love to cook or even just eat good food then I suggest signing up for this program early next year to guarantee a spot in one of our most popular and successful AO Revival programs of the year. Tickets this year were \$125.00 per person. The cost of the event is subsidized by Alpha Omega.

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

- Finley chop parsley, garlic, capers
- Add garlic to a small pot with enough oil to cover the garlic
- Cook on medium low heat for 3-5 minutes
- Make sure to stir often and keep an eye on It to prevent colour on the garlic
- Add capers, cook for 1 minute
- Add chili, cook for 1 minute
- Remove from heat and let cool completely
- Once completely cool, add parsley and add oil until a spoonable sauce consistency
- Right before serving, add a splash of red wine vinegar and a generous pinch of salt






